He was also Minister of the Presidency and of Employment in the Extremadura regional government from 1983 to 1987 and Member of the Extremadura regional parliament in the legislative periods 1987-1991 and 1991-1995.

During those years he held various positions in several committees (Confederated Savings Bank Social Work Study Group, Managing Committee of the Deposit Guarantee Fund at the Bank of Spain and the committee that drafted the Bylaws of the Spanish Confederation of Savings Banks). He has been a member of various Boards of Directors, including Ahorro Corporación, S.A., Corporación Empresarial de Extremadura, Lico Corporación, Dicogexsa, etc.

In the last decades he has spoken at numerous conferences at various Economy Forums. He is also the author of a number of articles for journals and periodicals on economic and social topics, the world of Savings and the Social Work carried out by the Savings Banks.
